



















#### JOHN GORMLEY

# SCOTLAND

With Scotland's schools starting their summer holidays at the end of June, July is traditionally a downtime for Scotland's youth GAA. However, it's not a GAA free month, far from it!

It started with a hurling summer camp at Crownpoint Sports Centre in Glasgow, where 30 boys and girls got to experience the magic of hurling through fun games and activities. Great credit must go to Grace, Pat and Liam of Ceann Creige hurling club who organised and ran the camp, along with other club members.

We also saw both our U15 girls' and boys' Scotland development squads travel to the Feile in Ireland where they had a great time. While both teams found the going tough, they were young squads and will no doubt benefit from the experience. The commitment from players, parents, and coaches for Feile is significant, and it's always amazing to see the effort Scotland's Gaelic Game's volunteers put into developing the sport here.

The month was bookended with another summer camp, this time a football one in Edinburgh. A notable element of the Dunedin Og summer camps is that all the coaches are female players who have come through the club youth section. These young women are inspiring the young players behind them, especially young girls to take up and continue football into their adulthood.

As August rolls around and the summer holidays near an end, the youth clubs of Scotland will meet to review the pre-summer fixtures and discuss the post-summer schedule which is packed with games. Coming up over the coming months are visits from Irish clubs, our indoor winter tournament programme, the Irish cultural day and multiple other tournaments for boys and girls from 6 to 18 years of age, culminating with our Christmas themed tournament in Glasgow in December.
